The conceptual sophistication imparted by training in philosophy is invaluable in virtually any field of learning or any profession. Students majoring in biology, psychology, history, or computer science would do well to pick up a second major in philosophy, a suggestion that the Department of Philosophy supports by offering standard and intensive major options. Students who do especially well in either the standard or intensive major program graduate with honors in philosophy. Because of the superior national reputation of the Department of Philosophy, a primary or secondary major in philosophy helps a graduate gain entry into a good graduate or professional school.
